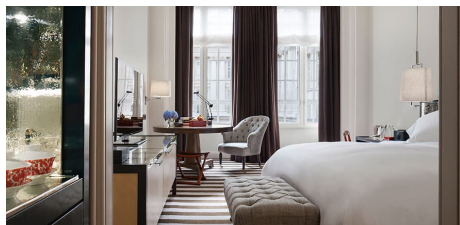


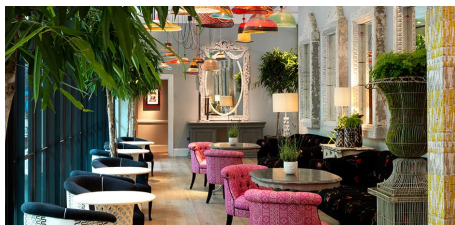

Best For: Well-heeled couples, single travelers and families with older children craving the cache, service and history of this London icon.

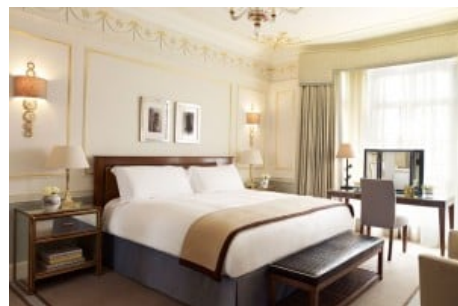

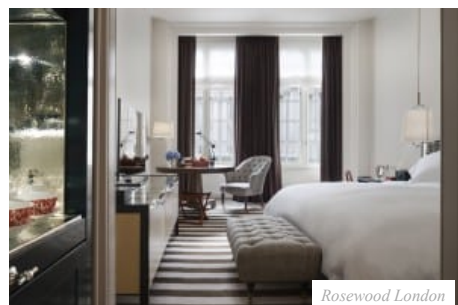

With its crackling fires, mahogany wood panelling and well-appointed rooms, The Connaught is perhaps the city's most quintessentially English property.

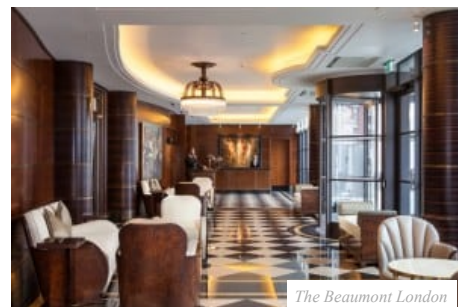
Best For: Travelers seeking contemporary British refinement without the stiff upper lip.
